A long blooming, upright series that flowers from late spring through to the fall; beautifully colored pea-like flowers are featured on tall stems, rising above green foliage; excellent performance in containers, borders or garden landscapes

Ornamental Features

Tower of Flowers Aurora Apricot Twinspur features dainty spikes of peach pea-like flowers with dark red eyes at the ends of the stems from late spring to early fall. Its small pointy leaves remain green in color throughout the season.

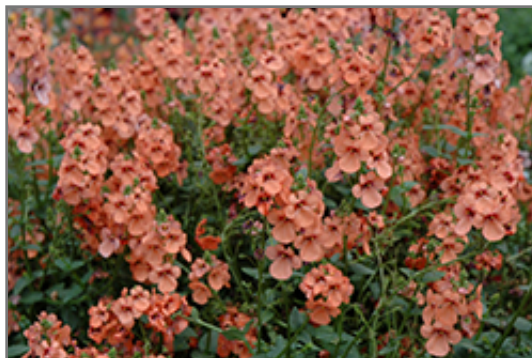
Landscape Attributes

Tower of Flowers Aurora Apricot Twinspur is an herbaceous annual with a ground-hugging habit of growth. Its relatively fine texture sets it apart from other garden plants with less refined foliage.

This plant will require occasional maintenance and upkeep, and should not require much pruning, except when necessary, such as to remove dieback. It has no significant negative characteristics.

- Border Edging

Planting & Growing

Tower of Flowers Aurora Apricot Twinspur will grow to be about 8 inches tall at maturity extending to 12 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 12 inches. When grown in masses or used as a bedding plant, individual plants should be spaced approximately 10 inches apart. Its foliage tends to remain low and dense right to the ground. This fast-growing annual will normally live for one full growing season, needing replacement the following year.

This plant does best in full sun to partial shade. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is highly tolerant of urban pollution and will even thrive in inner city environments. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid. It can be propagated by cuttings; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.

Tower of Flowers Aurora Apricot Twinspur is a fine choice for the garden, but it is also a good selection for planting in outdoor containers and hanging baskets. Because of its spreading habit of growth, it is ideally suited for use as a 'spiller' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination; plant it near the edges where it can spill gracefully over the pot. Note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden.
