



Chipolo Pink Titi Tree *Cliftonia monophylla 'Chipolo Pink'*

Description:

An unusual and attractive large shrub or small tree, presenting terminal clusters of beautifully fragrant pink flowers in mid-spring; a bushy native that resembles wax myrtle when not in bloom; takes pruning well; great in groupings or as a specimen

Ornamental Features

Chipolo Pink Titi Tree features showy clusters of fragrant pink flowers with white overtones at the ends of the branches from mid spring to early summer. The flowers are excellent for cutting. It has attractive dark green evergreen foliage. The glossy pointy leaves are highly ornamental and remain dark green throughout the winter.

Landscape Attributes

Chipolo Pink Titi Tree is a multi-stemmed evergreen shrub with a shapely oval form. Its average texture blends into the landscape, but can be balanced by one or two finer or coarser trees or shrubs for an effective composition.

This is a relatively low maintenance shrub, and should only be pruned after flowering to avoid removing any of the current season's flowers. It is a good choice for attracting bees and butterflies to your yard. It has no significant negative characteristics.

Chipolo Pink Titi Tree is recommended for the following landscape applications;

- Mass Planting
- Hedges/Screening

- Container Planting

Planting & Growing

Chipolo Pink Titi Tree will grow to be about 15 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 8 feet. It has a low canopy with a typical clearance of 1 foot from the ground, and is suitable for planting under power lines. It grows at a medium rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for 40 years or more.

This shrub does best in full sun to partial shade. It is quite adaptable, preferring to grow in average to wet conditions, and will even tolerate some standing water. It is not particular as to soil type, but has a definite preference for acidic soils, and is subject to chlorosis (yellowing) of the foliage in alkaline soils. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This is a selection of a native North American species.; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.

Chipolo Pink Titi Tree makes a fine choice for the outdoor landscape, but it is also well-suited for use in outdoor pots and containers. Because of its height, it is often used as a 'thriller' in the 'spiller-thriller-filler' container combination; plant it near the center of the pot, surrounded by smaller plants and those that spill over the edges. It is even sizeable enough that it can be grown alone in a suitable container. Note that when grown in a container, it may not perform exactly as indicated on the tag - this is to be expected. Also note that when growing plants in outdoor containers and baskets, they may require more frequent waterings than they would in the yard or garden.
