### Description:

A wonderful small to medium variety featuring wavy, lance shaped glossy green foliage; lavender flowers appear in the mid summer months; adds color, contrast and texture to small garden beds, borders or patio containers; low maintenance

### Ornamental Features

Spartan Arrow Hosta features dainty spikes of lavender tubular flowers rising above the foliage in early summer. Its attractive large glossy narrow leaves remain emerald green in colour throughout the season.

### Landscape Attributes

Spartan Arrow Hosta is a dense herbaceous perennial with tall flower stalks held atop a low mound of foliage. Its relatively coarse texture can be used to stand it apart from other garden plants with finer foliage.

This is a relatively low maintenance plant, and is best cleaned up in early spring before it resumes active growth for the season. Gardeners should be aware of the following characteristic(s) that may warrant special consideration;

- Insects

### Planting & Growing

Spartan Arrow Hosta will grow to be only 6 inches tall at maturity extending to 9 inches tall with the flowers, with a spread of 16 inches. When grown in masses or used as a bedding plant, individual plants should be spaced approximately 8 inches apart. Its foliage tends to remain low and dense right to the ground. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for approximately 10 years. As an herbaceous perennial, this plant will usually die back to the crown each winter, and will regrow from the base each spring. Be careful not to disturb the crown in late winter when it may not be readily seen!

This plant does best in partial shade to shade. It prefers to grow in average to moist conditions, and shouldn't be allowed to dry out. This plant should not require much in the way of fertilizing once established, although it may appreciate a shot of general-purpose fertilizer from time to time early in the growing season. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This particular variety is an interspecific hybrid. It can be propagated by division; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.
